### Coronavirus (COVID-19): Catch-up funding plan

The government provided schools with £650 million of universal catch-up premium funding for the 2020-2021 academic Year. The aim of the funding is to help pupils catch up on education they have missed due to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. Schools use this funding for specific activities to support their pupils to make up for lost learning over the previous months. While the funding has been allocated on a per-pupil or per-place basis, schools use the amount available to them as a single total from which to prioritise support according to their needs.
