






# **SCHOOL UNIFORM**

In addition to the scheduled activities, our cadets were able to meet new people and socialise with students their own age from all over the North West. It was also the first opportunity many had to see what it was like to live away from their home comforts.

The event kicked off with a teacher's obstacle race, (unfortunately Mr. Hibbert refused to take part due to last year's disqualification - sour grapes!).








Would your child or children like to take part in fun and exciting activities during the summer school holidays?

They are completely free of charge for eligible children and include a healthy meal.

The 2022 summer programme follows the success of our Holiday Activities and Food programmes that ran over the summer and winter of 2021, and Easter this year.

Face to face activities will take place from Monday 25 July to Friday 26 August 2022.

Parents or carers of eligible children can book up to 16 x four hour sessions for each child, over the holiday activity period. Activities are subject to availability, please book early.

The activities are free to children who are eligible for benefit related free school meals. You may be charged if you book into activities and your child or children are not eligible.

Many of our providers are able to offer activities to children of all needs and abilities. If your child has been identified as having a special educational need or disability, please talk to the provider when you book in, to ensure their needs are able to be met.

Bury Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme activities are brought to you through Bury Council, in partnership with Bury Voluntary, Community and Faith Alliance and they are funded by the Department for Education.

We hope you have a fantastic summer holiday and that your children have the opportunity to take part in some of the great activities on offer, have lots of fun and make new friends!

# Safeguarding School Rules

#### **Appointments**

#### Years 7-9

All pupils <u>must</u> be collected from reception by a parent / carer or responsible adult aged over 18 years. A letter or appointment card to be handed in at reception when signing out.

#### Years 10 & 11

Pupils are allowed to make their own way to appointments <u>if</u> they have a letter of authorisation from a parent / carer <u>or</u> a phone call / email has been received by office staff (letters <u>must</u> be handed in at reception and either copied or kept as confirmation evidence). Head of year <u>must</u> authorise pupils to leave / sign appointment card.

#### **Unwell Pupils**

Head Of Year or Senior Leadership Team **must** authorise pupils to go home (unless medical emergency).

All pupils to be collected from reception by a parent / carer or responsible adult over 18 years.

Depending on the nature of illness some pupils are allowed to be sent home via taxi if the parent / carer requests – Head Of Year <u>must</u> authorise this. Parent/carer than has the responsibility to contact school to confirm their child/children have arrived home safely.

# **NHS Library - Mental Health Apps**

<u>Stay Alive App</u> is a pocket suicide prevent app which offers help and support to both people with thoughts of suicide and to people concerned about someone else. It is packed with useful information to help you and others stay safe. The app can be personalised to tailor it to the user. The app includes a safety plan, customisable reasons for living, and a box where you can store photos that are important to you.

<u>Bluelce</u> is an prescribed evidence-based app to help young people manage their emotions and reduce urges to self-harm. It includes a mood diary, a toolbox of evidence-based techniques to reduce distress and automatic routing to emergency numbers if urges to harm continue.

distrACT app gives you easy, quick and discreet access to information and advice about self-harm and suicidal thoughts. Led by experienced practising GP and other leading experts. The content has been created by doctors and experts in self-harming and suicide prevention.

MeeTwo app provides a safe and secure forum for teenagers wanting to discuss any issue affecting their lives. You can anonymously get advice from experts or other teenagers going through similar experiences in areas such as mental health, self-harming, relationships and friendships.

<u>SilverCloud</u> is an online course to help you manage stress, anxiety and depression. You work through a series of topics selected by a therapist to address specific needs. The eight-week course is designed be completed in your own time and at your own pace.

<u>Sleepstation</u> is free with a GP referral. It consists of a 6-week online course for people who struggle to fall asleep or stay asleep through the night. The course is tailored to your needs, using the information you provide, and gives you access to a team of sleep experts who will offer helpful advice and support throughout.

Student Health App provides easy access to more than 900 pages of reliable health information all in once place. The content has been created for university students by NHS doctors and is regularly updated. The app is aimed to reduce your worries, feel more confident and get the support you need at what can be a challenging time for any student.

<u>ThinkNinja</u> is a mental health app designed for 10 to 18 year olds. Using a variety of content and tools, it allows young people to learn about mental health and emotional wellbeing. and develop skills they use to build resilience and stay well.

WorryTree App aims to help you take control of worry wherever you are. You cause the app to record whatever you feel worried about. It uses cognitive behavioural therapy techniques to help you notice and challenge your worries. It can also help you create an action plan for managing worry.
