 Assignment deadlines are set by the exam board throughout Years 10 and 11 and these must be met in order to pass the course.

- An interest in developing your composition (music making) skills.

*Many <u>transferrable skills</u> are developed, which could be used across other subject areas.



What will I do in BTEC Music lessons?









- Perform as a soloist on your main instrument or voice.
- Perform in groups, as an ensemble.
- Compose (write) your own music in different styles.
- •Use Music technology in order to compose and sample music.
- Learn about different styles and genres of music.
