

Appointments

Please try to make appointments out of school hours. If this is unavoidable then please ensure pupils are aware of what time they need to meet you at the school office.

Staff will not interrupt lessons to collect pupils for Appointments.

Years 7-9

All pupils must be collected from reception by a parent / carer or responsible adult aged over 18 years. A letter or appointment card to be handed in at reception when signing out.

Years 10 & 11

Pupils are allowed to make their own way to appointments if they have a letter of authorisation from a parent / carer or a phone call has been received by office staff (letters must be handed in to the Attendance Office and either copied or kept as confirmation evidence).

Unwell Pupils

Head of Year must authorise pupils to go home (unless medical emergency).

All pupils to be collected from reception by a parent / carer or responsible adult over 18 years. Depending on the nature of illness some pupils are allowed to be sent home via taxi if the parent / carer requests – Head of Year must authorise this.

the register, a strike on their Star card and a Detention.

If attendance falls below 92% medical evidence will be required.



Reporting a Medical Appointment

Medical or Dental appointments should be made, whenever possible, outside of school hours.

If appointments are unavoidable during school hours. We request that the appointment does not affect registration so pupils can still get a present mark for both morning and afternoon registration.



At least 24 hours' notice of any medical appointments.

Please also include Medical Evidence.



Please make sure your child is aware of what time they are being collected.

Pupils are responsible for making sure that they are at Reception ready to be collected and sign out.

Office staff will not always be available to interrupt lessons to collect pupils.





PLACE 2 BE

Place 2 Be Counselling and Mental Health Support

Pupils use Place 2 Be for lots of reasons. The most common ones are anxiety, struggling to focus, low self-esteem, mood swings and trouble with their family. Pupils can book a Place 2 Talk session to talk about problems and worries, or weekly counselling is available every weekday apart from Wednesday.

MY VOICE MATTERS

10 WAYS TO LOOK AFTER YOUR MENTAL HEALTH

Here are some brilliant tips from young people just like you on how you can look after your mental health.



- Don't keep it all to yourself and spend too much time in your own head. This can sometimes make it keep piling up, and make you feel worse.
- Talk to someone you trust and feel comfortable with—a teacher, parent, sibling, cousin, friend... if you can't think of anyone and need to talk, try talking to someone like Shout by texting SHOUT to 85258 for free.
- Write your thoughts and feelings down.
- Keep in contact with people, don't isolate yourself.
- Don't dismiss your feelings because you think they aren't valid. Everything you feel is valid and important to you.



- Focus on the good parts of your life and doing what you love, rather than the negative.
- If you feel like harming yourself then tell someone you trust and distract yourself in the meanwhile.
- Do something you enjoy to help you relax and have a break – watch a film, play a game, watch your favourite YouTuber, listen to music.
- Be your own best friend because at the end of the day, you're stuck with you – so look after yourself!
- Remember that you're not alone, even if it sometimes feels like you are.




DANCE NEWS

Cyber and Signals Weekend

During the weekend, the Cadets completed a CyberFirst Adventurers
Course and Signals Training on the Personal Role Radio (PRR). The
Adventure Course has been written by the National Cyber Security
Centre and provides an insight into the world of cyber and how
common threats can be managed. The course introduces various
elements including looking at cyber security, data mining,
cryptography and networking

One skill that is vital whatever you do in life is the ability to communicate clearly, confidently and effectively, and that is the heart of Signals Training in the Army Cadets. The cadets learned how to set up and operate the Personal Role Radio and establish communications, understand the advantages and disadvantages of the communications systems. The cadets will be putting it into practice on the Fieldcraft weekend in April.

Hello! I'm Miss Khan, and I am the new Librarian at Philips High School. I am looking forward to working to promote the library and reading.


